



CONSTRUCTION ALERT - July 29, 2008

Over the next month, construction activities will be occurring as follows:

Locations:

- **Atlantic Street** between the Railroad Bridge and Henry Street
- **John Street** between Dock Street and the old Manhattan Street
- **Dock Street**
- **Jefferson Street (side opposite the railroad yard)** between the east branch canal and Canal Street

Type of Work:

- **Atlantic Street** – Removal of utility poles on the side opposite the train station parking garage. Installation of new traffic signal poles at the Atlantic Street/Station Place intersection. Installation of remaining concrete curb and sidewalk. On the side of Atlantic Street in front of the parking garage, crews will be removing the curb and sidewalks and begin roadway reconfiguration.
- **John Street** – Installation of sanitary sewer. Utility company work.
- **Dock Street** – Installation of sanitary sewer. Installation of storm sewer. Utility company work.
- **Jefferson Street** – Installation of storm sewer.

Please know that work in the area of 114 Manhattan Street and 1 Dock Street is performed under an EPA Brownfields cleanup grant. Any material excavated on John Street in close proximity to the Brownfield's sites may exhibit an odor. Construction workers may also be seen wearing safety protective gear during construction operations. The material excavated in this area is continually tested for proper disposal. Air quality monitoring is performed to monitor airborne contaminant concentrations and oxygen content.

Traffic Pattern Changes:

- **Atlantic Street** – Two-way traffic will be shifted east onto the area of the newly paved widened roadway so that work can occur adjacent to the parking garage.
- **John Street** – Traffic on John Street will be restricted to one lane during the sanitary sewer operation with Traffic Officers onsite. Work requiring a one lane traffic pattern is expected to occur for two weeks.
- **Dock Street** – Remains closed.
- **Jefferson Street** – Traffic lanes will be narrowed, but maintained through the area of construction with Traffic Officers onsite.

Traffic Officers will assist with directing traffic as needed. Traffic enforcement will be in effect.
