

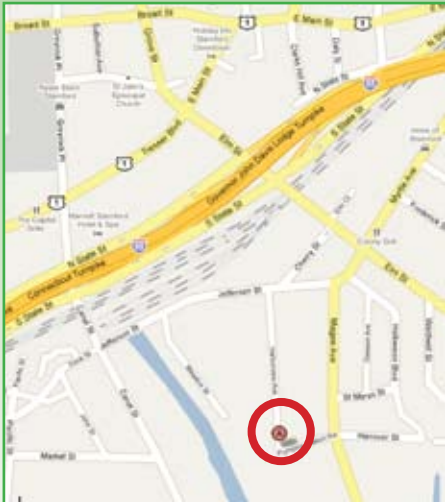
Directions to the Katrina Mygatt Recycling Center

From East Main Street

Drive south on Myrtle Avenue to Jefferson Street, then turn left onto Harborview Avenue. Go to the end and straight into the entrance of the complex.

From Tresser Boulevard

Drive south on Canal Street, then turn left onto Jefferson Street and right onto Harborview Avenue. Go to the end and straight into the entrance of the complex.



Katrina Mygatt Recycling Center

Dedicated in 1995, the recycling center is named in memory of the late Stamford resident Katrina Mygatt. A tireless advocate for environmental causes, she began lobbying for a recycling center as far back as the 1960s. On average, 2,000 residents use the center every week.

Stamford residents can bring bulky waste and yard waste as well as garbage and recyclables to the Katrina Mygatt Recycling and Drop-off Center.

Here's how it works...

Getting a Permit...

A free residential permit is required to utilize the recycling center. Vehicles with commercial or combination plates cannot obtain a permit.

Bring your vehicle registration and proof of Stamford residency to the Scale House at the Transfer Station Complex, 109 Harborview Avenue.

Permits are issued at the following times:

Monday – Friday
8:00 am – 2:30 pm

Saturday
6:30 am – 2:30 pm



At the Recycling Center...

Once you have your permit, you can bring items to the recycling center.

Recycling center hours:

Monday – Friday
7:30 am – 3:00 pm

Saturday
7:30 am – 2:30 pm

Unload your items and place them in the proper containers. There are separate containers for metal, household garbage, yard waste, construction debris, and recycling. Separating items by category as you load them into your car at home will make your job easier when you arrive. Attendants are available to direct you and answer any questions you might have.

You can bring up to 200 pounds of material per day in a passenger vehicle for free. If it looks like you have more than 200 pounds, your vehicle will be weighed and you will pay \$4.10 per 100 pounds for the additional weight. The scales close at 2:00 pm Monday through Friday and at 2:30 pm on Saturday.

The following materials are not accepted for disposal:

- Tires
- Asbestos Shingles
- Batteries
- Chemicals
- Hazardous Waste
- Oil-Based Paint

Different rules apply for commercial vehicles, pick-up trucks, cars with trailers, rental trucks and vehicles with combination or commercial plates.

You can also drop off recyclables (cardboard, newspaper, mixed paper, metal, plastic/glass/cans) at the Scofieldtown Road Recycling Center located in North Stamford at the corner of Scofieldtown Road and Rockrimmon Road.
